Compton Co. Forbidden North Tor. Dumping

A complaint to Torrance police Tuesday revealed that the Southern California Straw Sales Company operated by Norman M. Kazarian of Compton, was hauling straw and manure from the Hollywood Park race track in Inglewood and dumping it into a 14-acre plot in North Torrance. Kazarian stated to the City Engineer's department that he had leased the property at 174th st. and Ainsworth alley with the understanding that it was permissible to use the property for the purpose of spreading the straw for drying and baling it for sale. He was informed by the Engineer's office that it was illegal to use property in that area for such purpose and was given two weeks in which to bale and remove the straw. He was told not to haul any more straw into the lots.

Moving of Los Angeles Bus Depot, Rental of New Equipment Suggested

Suggestions for improvement of the Municipal Bus Lines, including moving the Los Angeles depot to the Pacific Electric station at 6th and Main, and contracting for new buses on a mileage basis were handed the City Council Tuesday afternoon by William Murphey, acting manager of the lines.

Murphey told the Council that the bus fund has a balance of \$19,537 on hand. The Los Angeles ticket office is costing \$10,200 a year to operate, he said, urging the elimination of tickets and moving the depot to the Pacific Electric station, which he declared could be accomplished for a fee of perhaps \$50 to \$100 a month. He said that move would save \$5,000 a year.

He urged that all fares run through the fare boxes to end what he alleged to be misuse of tickets, failing to punch tickets and selling them again. He said that this practice is largely being eliminated.

Also, he said that \$3,000 a year can be saved by purchasing a gasoline pump and installing it at the bus yard, thus saving the 1 cent a gallon fee now being paid to a service station for pumping gas.

Buses of the department are traveling from 35,000 to 41,000 miles a month, and the revenue per mile to Los Angeles now is running 45 cents. He said that the Crown buses are being overloaded, at times hauling as many as 122 passengers at once. They are built as 46-passenger buses. The Crowns travel 7,000 miles a month and the Fords 4,000 to 5,000 miles a month, he declared, and suggested that the Whites will soon have to be junked.

Murphey said that unless new buses are obtained, the cost of operation will go up materially, and urged the rental of equipment. He offered the city contract with the Commerce Traffic Council providing for rental of buses as needed by the city to permit improvement of service to Los Angeles and expansion of local service to give transportation to

outlying districts such as North Torrance and Hollywood Riviera. Also, he suggested establishment of the Long Beach to Inglewood run would be made possible under new arrangement.

The buses would be operated by the City of Torrance as at present, but the city would pay the owners a small sum per mile for their use. It will be less than the 4 cents per mile paid A. S. Bury Truck Co. for buses when the municipal lines were established, it was pointed out.

The contract will be discussed by the Council tonight at 8:15 p.m., after Murphey and City Attorney Otto B. Willett have checked the instrument for legality.

Cost Of Repairs To Fire Station To Date, \$1,039

Repairs to the Torrance Fire station were in the advanced stages this week with reinforcing and bracing of the roof completed.

Under the supervision of Sam Levy, local merchant, the work is going along as scheduled, it was reported.

The cost as recorded up to this morning, not including the concrete bond-beam on the roof for which a figure has not yet been received, is set at \$1,039.68. Of this amount, \$413.15 is for materials and \$626.53 for labor.


Reinforcing of the walls is now in progress and the fenceguard around the station was removed completely yesterday.


