
County Public Guardian Chas. L. Overshiner boasted today that California is one of only five states in the United States which have such an official position.

El Camino Temporary Buildings Authorized By Board Of Trustees

At a special meeting of the Board of Trustees of El Camino Junior College District, approval of the location of the temporary buildings for El Camino College was given. They will be situated near the southeast corner of the property at the intersection of Crenshaw Boulevard and Redondo Beach Boulevard. The board authorized the architect to proceed with working drawings for the temporary units. Adequate parking space will also be provided for student and public cars. The plans provide for seventeen classrooms, a cafeteria, library, student store, and administration offices.

Copies of the college bulletin have been handed to the Torrance Herald by President Murdock and are available to any student interested.

He also announced that during the months of July and August while the college buildings are being established on the Crenshaw-Redondo site the college offices will be maintained at Inglewood High School in Room 208, Building I. 
