Plan Observance for Birthday Of John Paul Jones

A nation ever grateful for the sacrifices and courageous deeds of her war heroes will pay tribute July 6 on the 200th anniversary of the birth of one of her earliest patriots and one of the founders of the Navy's traditions of heroism and victory, John Paul Jones.

As a part of the nation-wide bi-centennial observances, naval activities in Southern California have planned elaborate open house celebrations.

Paying tribute to the famous Navy man whose words, "I have not yet begun to fight," have become immortal to most Americans, the U. S. Naval Shipyard, Terminal island, San Pedro, plans an impressive John Paul Jones "open house" Sunday, July 6, from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m. Special exhibition of diving equipment and shop exhibits are planned for the event.

The U. S. Naval hospital, Long Beach, will be open to visitors for the special Bicentennial observances from 2 to 4 p. m., Sunday, July 6, officials announced.

"Welcome Aboard" will be extended to visitors by the Naval Reserve Training ships USS Twining and the USS Wedderburn, from 10 a. m. to 5 p. m. Sunday, July 6. The ships will be tied up in San Pedro for inspection tours.

The Naval Air station at Los Alamitos will be open for inspection, July 6, from 1 to 4 p. m., as a part of the Bicentennial. The Naval Air station at Santa Ana plans an "open house" from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. with an airship hangar slated to be open for inspection.

Chapel Choir To Appear Sunday

The Chapel Choir, nationally famous concert group from Columbus, Ohio, has been booked for a concert locally in the First Congregational church, Third and Cedar, Long Beach, on Sunday, July 6, at 8 p. m. 
