**Incinerators Of Homes Smog Factor—Darby**

The half million or more incinerators in back yards of Los Angeles County will be banned by law within ten years, Raymond V. Darby, chairman of the Board of Supervisors declared today.

According to Darby, one small incinerator makes little smoke but 500,000 of them add up to a serious problem. He said that the old methods of rubbish control by which waste was burned had ended because of the smoke nuisance and that new methods call for incinerators which are smokeless and odorless.

Two such incinerators will be built in the county during the next year at a cost of \$1,800,000.
