King Presents Revolver To Truman

Rep. Cecil K. King, who represents Torrance and the Harbor district in Washington, has presented President Truman with the first .38 caliber service revolver turned out by the Smith & Wesson Firearms Co. for World War II. Carrying the serial No. VI the revolver was the first of 1,112,000 sidearms manufactured by the firm for the armed forces during the war. King's collection of firearms is considered to be one of the finest in the country. The most enthusiastic gun collector on Capitol Hill, King said the President expressed "great delight" when the presentation was made.



Famed Vatican Choir Will Appear In Hollywood Bowl Sept. 21, 22

One of the outstanding musical events in Southern California's history will take place on the evenings of Sept. 21 and 22 in Hollywood Bowl, when the famed Vatican Choir, direct from Rome, appears in concert. This marks the first time a choir has ever left the Vatican City since 314 A. D., when Rome's church singers were first organized into choral groups under Pope Sylvester I. Under the direction of Rt. Rev. Msgr. Licio Refice, one of the world's foremost conductor-composers of liturgical music, the choir—composed of 60 selected voices—will offer a program of the sacred music of the Catholic as well as the Jewish and English-speaking churches. Of the 60 voices in the choir, 24 are boys ranging in ages from 8 to 15, while the rest are adults. They were brought together from all over Italy, having been selected for the excellent quality of their voices. The choir is made up of voices that sing regularly in the four major basilicas in the Vatican City: St. Peter, St. John Lateran, Santa Maria Maggiore and the Sistine Chapel. The members of the choir are a colorful group, appearing on stage in the surplices and cassocks identical to those they have worn in Vatican choir lofts for hundreds of years. Their acapella singing, which offers the "voce bianca," or treble voice, is as old as the Roman Catholic church itself. It is reminiscent of the muffled chants

Harbor Area Home Building Shows Increase

Harbor district home building is increasing by leaps and bounds according to figures on file at the San Pedro building office. Home building permits issued in June were more than twice that of any previous month, officials said. A total of 48 permits totaling \$287,410 were issued. Included were five permits for Harbor City aggregating \$21,460 and 12 for the Shoestring strip totaling \$49,110. The Shoestring strip, attracting moderate priced home construction, is leading the harbor area in home building with 90 permits issued since the first of the year. Total cost: \$164,930. Harbor City has accumulated 25 home building permits in 1947 totaling \$151,651. Harbor City homes have averaged \$6,066 each; Shoestring strip homes, \$5,166.
