Boundaries And Schedules For Fall Bus Runs Given By School Board

(Continued from page 1-A)

Sepulveda to a line separating Block 1 and Block 22 of Tract No. 2200, then south along this line to the southerly edge of Tract No. 2200, then westerly along this line to McDonald st., west on McDonald (230th st.) to the west edge of Sepulveda to Torrance City limit and following the City boundary around Del Amo Estate to Hawthorne avenue.

(4) Pupils of Torrance Elementary School may ride the buses if they live within a line beginning at the boundary line of the City of Torrance at 233rd st., then following that boundary south, and on to the west end of 240th st., then north one block to the southerly edge of Tract No. 2200 and westerly to a line between Block 11 and 12, then north to a projection of 233rd st., then east on 233rd to Pennsylvania ave., south on Pennsylvania one block to 235th st., east on 235th to Eshelman and north on Eshelman to 233rd and east to the point of beginning.

(5) Waltersia School pupils living beyond a north-south line at the intersection of Highway 101 and Crenshaw blvd., as it is shown on Torrance City map and those pupils living in the Ellinwood Tract may use the buses.

Where a boundary follows a street in any of the five divisions noted above, students on each side of the street will be allowed to ride the bus. This does not apply however when the street is also a school district boundary.

Librarian's Talk On Sports Topics Fools Listeners

Mrs. Dorothy Jamieson, Torrance librarian, talked to Torrance Lions club members Tuesday noon, and she fooled her listeners.

Instead of giving a discourse on what is proper reading and what is improper for adult consumption, she talked about books on fishing, hunting and other popular subjects, which have been good sellers on the bookstore shelves.

Three "school teachers" were in her audience, Herbert E. Irwin, head of the social studies department of Torrance High school, Albert R. Posner, principal of Fern avenue school and William Clinkenbeard, principal of 7th and 8th grades at Torrance High school, and she took pleasure in addressing remarks to them.

(2) Bus No. 2, Run No. 1, A. M.—will carry approximately 50 7th and 8th grade pupils from the Waltersia and Fern Avenue areas to the High School. The first stop will be made at Seaside Rancho at 7:30 a. m., from there the bus will travel to Ward st., in Waltersia, south on Newton st. to Hawthorne, (stops in Waltersia to be made at Ward and 24th, Newton and Hawthorne, Hawthorne and 242nd), then north on Hawthorne to Spencer, (stops at 236th, Sepulveda, Torrance blvd., and Spencer st.) then east on Spencer to Amie, south on Amie to Torrance blvd., (a stop at Emerald st.) then east on Torrance blvd. to the High School.

(3) Bus No. 3, Run No. 1, A. M.—will serve approximately 30 7th and 8th grade students of the Torrance Elementary School area. The first stop will be at the corner of 236th and Narbonne at 7:30 a. m. From there the bus will stop at intersections. It will travel west on 236th to Pennsylvania, south on Pennsylvania to 239th, east on 239th to Narbonne, north on Narbonne to 238th, east on 238th to Eshelman, north on Eshelman to 236th, west on 236th to Narbonne, then on to the High School where the 7th and 8th grade classes will be held.

(4) Bus No. 1, Run No. 2, A. M.—will serve approximately 35 Perry Elementary School pupils. This run will begin at approximately 8:20 a. m. Stops will be made at intersections only. The first stop will be made at Arlington and 190th. The bus then travels north on 174th to Crenshaw, north on Crenshaw to 164th, west on 164th to Illinois, south on Illinois to 174th, east on 174th to Western, south on Western to 182nd and west on 182nd to Prairie ave., and north on Prairie to Perry School. The last stop in this run is at Crenshaw blvd. and 182nd st.

(5) Bus No. 2, Run No. 2, A. M.—will serve approximately 60 Torrance elementary school students. There may be more than the 60 pupils in this area. If so the run will be divided and two short runs will be made. This run will begin at 8:15 at the corner of Narbonne and 236th. The bus will travel west on 236th and follow the same route as Bus No. 3 on the 7th and 8th grade run. The bus will stop at intersections only.

(6) Bus No. 3, Run No. 2, A. M.—will serve the Waltersia and Fern avenue area which has approximately 45 pupils to transport. The first stop will be at Seaside Rancho at approximately 8:20 a. m. after discharging its load of 7th and 8th graders in the same area.

(7) Bus No. 1, Run No. 3, P. M.—will return the Torrance elementary area 7th and 8th graders to their homes. This bus will also leave the high school at approximately 3:10. It will follow the A. M. route and discharge pupils as they were picked up in the morning.

(8) Bus No. 2, Run No. 3, P. M.—will carry the Fern avenue 4th, 5th and 6th graders home. It will arrive at Fern avenue at approximately 3:45 after completing the 7th and 8th grade and Waltersia intermediate run. This run should end about 4:00 p. m.

(9) Bus No. 3, Run No. 3, P. M.—will leave Torrance elementary school at approximately 3:10 and follow the morning route in reverse. Then the bus will stop at Waltersia to pick up 4th, 5th and 6th graders and proceed to Seaside Rancho for the end of the run.

(10) Bus No. 1, Run No. 2, P. M.—will serve the 57 Perry school area 7th and 8th graders who ride the morning bus. The bus will leave the high school at 3:10 and follow the morning route.


(11) Bus No. 2, Run No. 2, P. M.—will carry 7th and 8th graders to Fern avenue and Waltersia areas. The bus will leave the high school at 3:10 and follow the morning route in reverse. Then the bus will stop at Waltersia to pick up 4th, 5th and 6th graders and proceed to Seaside Rancho for the end of the run.

(12) Bus No. 3, Run No. 2, P. M.—will return the Torrance elementary area 7th and 8th graders to their homes. This bus will also leave the high school at approximately 3:10. It will follow the A. M. route and discharge pupils as they were picked up in the morning.

(13) Bus No. 1, Run No. 3, P. M.—will take the Perry school 4th, 5th and 6th graders home. The bus should be at the school ready to load at approximately 3:40 p. m. after discharging its load of 7th and 8th graders in the same area.

(14) Bus No. 2, Run No. 3, P. M.—will carry the Fern avenue 4th, 5th and 6th graders home. It will arrive at Fern avenue at approximately 3:45 after completing the 7th and 8th grade and Waltersia intermediate run. This run should end about 4:00 p. m.

(15) Bus No. 3, Run No. 3, P. M.—will leave Torrance elementary

will serve approximately 37 primary pupils from Torrance elementary school. The bus will leave the school at about 2:15 p. m. and follow the morning run of Bus No. 3, Run No. 1, a. m.

(9) Bus No. 3, Run No. 1, P. M.—will serve nearly 30 Fern avenue and Waltersia primary pupils. The bus will leave the Fern avenue school at 2:15 and distribute the pupils in reverse order to the morning. The first stop will be at Amie st. and Emerald. From there the bus will follow the route of the morning run and will arrive at Waltersia school at approximately 2:30. Then the primary pupils will be taken to Seaside Rancho. The run will be extended should there be children at the opposite side of the district.

(10) Bus No. 1, Run No. 2, P. M.—will serve the 57 Perry school area 7th and 8th graders who ride the morning bus. The bus will leave the high school at 3:10 and follow the morning route.

(11) Bus No. 2, Run No. 2, P. M.—will carry 7th and 8th graders to Fern avenue and Waltersia areas. The bus will leave the high school at 3:10 and follow the morning route in reverse. Then the bus will stop at Waltersia to pick up 4th, 5th and 6th graders and proceed to Seaside Rancho for the end of the run.

(12) Bus No. 3, Run No. 2, P. M.—will return the Torrance elementary area 7th and 8th graders to their homes. This bus will also leave the high school at approximately 3:10. It will follow the A. M. route and discharge pupils as they were picked up in the morning.

(13) Bus No. 1, Run No. 3, P. M.—will take the Perry school 4th, 5th and 6th graders home. The bus should be at the school ready to load at approximately 3:40 p. m. after discharging its load of 7th and 8th graders in the same area.
