**3800 Letters To Go Out In Cancer Drive**

Mrs. J. P. Montague, chairman of the Cancer Drive committee, has announced that 3,800 letters are to be sent to those in the residential section requesting donations for the Cancer hospital. The Torrance Junior Woman's club, with the help and advice of leading citizens in the community, are sponsoring the drive in Torrance. Business houses and doctors will be contacted and industrial plants will be given scrolls.

"Receipts will be sent for all donations," Mrs. Montague said. "Money will be used in building, equipping and endowing the Cancer hospital which will be in Los Angeles, and will be the only such hospital west of St. Louis.

"Only three out of 10 cancer patients are cured now. Five out of 10 are given effective treatment but cannot be cured with present methods.

"Los Angeles has competent physicians who can and do discover and effectively treat cancer, and has the Cancer Prevention Society clinic for the detection of early cancer. But Los Angeles' facilities are limited in existing hospitals for cancer patients.

"This is the situation we now face. Your money today may mean your life tomorrow."




