He picked up the two men at Broadway and Pasadena ave., in Los Angeles, and was ordered to drive them to Helen drive.


When Overton stopped his cab one of the passengers covered him with a revolver while the other searched him, taking his wallet.

Youth Band To Construct Home

One of the main projects of Torrance Area Youth Bands for this year will be the construction of a residence which will be sold and the profits used for the band, according to James Van Dyck, director.

Work is scheduled to begin within the next two weeks and the house is scheduled to be ready for sale sometime around the first part of December.

Sensational Air Ray Gun Made In Torrance

The Longren Aircraft Company, which was forced to cut back its operations during the past year, has succeeded in negotiating a contract for five hundred thousand "Air Ray Guns" (a sensational new toy) for the Budson Company, of Chula Vista, California and the Rondat Corp. of New York.

"This contract, along with large quantities of specialized aircraft and steel fabricating work, has resulted in a backlog amounting to war-time proportions," Chapman Wentworth, president, said. "It will be necessary for this company to hire approximately 50 new employees to meet the required schedules," he said. "Applications are being taken now and hiring will be made through to the end of September. Work being done is expected to be of a highly permanent nature and it is contemplated that expanded plant facilities will ultimately be required."

The sensational new toy is of all-aluminum manufacture, plus a gum rubber diaphragm which holds air in a tight chamber until discharged by pressing the trigger. The air discharge is of sufficient velocity to blow out a candle 30 feet away from the gun and it is absolutely harmless, according to Wentworth. It was designed by Bill Shelton of Chula Vista, Calif., who was with the chemical warfare division of the Army during World War II. Shelton was a designer of guns to fire gas charges, and decided to apply one of his exclusive developments to a toy.

The "Air Ray Gun" is the result, Wentworth said.
