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## Changes Noted In NSLI Clauses On Beneficiary

Many veterans who took out National Service Life Insurance some time ago will find it advisable to reconsider the designation of beneficiaries of their policies, according to James G. Caldwell, director of the Torrance Area Veterans Service Center, since restrictions on the naming of beneficiaries have been lifted. The veteran now may designate any person or persons, firm, corporation, or other legal entity, including his estate, as the principal beneficiary or beneficiaries under his policy, either individually or as a trustee. Formerly, only close relatives could be named.

The insured also has the right to designate one or more secondary beneficiaries. Circumstances such as the death of a beneficiary, marriage, divorce, or birth of a child usually call for a change in the naming of a beneficiary, yet in many cases nothing has been done by the veteran to take care of this vital matter.

## All Trailers in Camps Must Be Licensed—Quinn

Out of 122,500 trailers in trailer camps in Los Angeles County, from 55 to 60 per cent are unlicensed by the Motor Vehicle Department, and steps are being taken now to require that all vehicles, whether roadworthy or not, be licensed, according to County Assessor John R. Quinn.

Unlicensed coaches assessed by the County will be a lien against the real estate upon which the coaches are located, he said. It is provided in the Health and Safety Code that all such trailer coaches shall carry a current yearly license, Quinn said.

Inasmuch as the license fees so collected are distributed to the cities and counties with the exception of the cost of collection by the Motor Vehicle Department, this represents a sharp loss of revenue to the various cities and the county itself, Assessor Quinn continued. "We have advised the California Motor Court & Trailer Park Owners' Association that unless these trailer coaches take out licenses with the Motor Vehicle Department, which are in lieu of all local taxes, we will proceed to assess all such unlicensed motor coaches." In the event that these unlicensed motor coaches are assessed it will be made a lien against the real estate upon which they are situated and it will be necessary for each property owner to make the necessary adjustments with the more or less permanent occupants of his trailer court, Quinn concluded.
