The Irishmen, who doubtless have different plans for the afternoon, sport a reportedly strong aggregation, well bolstered with professional stars. Starting time: 2:15 p.m.

A highly regarded Mandell Truck nine, went down before the Merchants Sunday, 10-0, in the league opener.

Erv Palica gave 4 hits in the encounter as the efficient Lomita defense played errorless ball for the shutout.

The locals scored in every inning but the fifth and the eighth, being the game to all intents and purposes with 4 runs in the seventh frame.

Palica and Williams shared hitting honors with three safeties each, followed by Manager Gus Muehler and Gibb, who alternated behind the plate, with two apiece.

Muehler then lofted out his second double for the afternoon driving in all three, then came in himself off Erv Palica's single.

## Wilson Meets Brooks At Bowl

"California" Jackie Wilson, the leading challenger for the world welterweight boxing title from the Pacific coast, and Jimmy Brooks of Los Angeles have been signed for the 10-round main event of the pro boxing show at the Wilmington Bowl next Wednesday night.

Wilson is just off a non-title bout with Ray "Sugar" Robinson, and is expected to head east soon to track down Robinson for a title bout in his own backyard at Madison Square Garden.

The six-round semi-windup will find Frankie Lieberman of Long Beach, nationally rated as a lightweight contender, and Lem Thomas, who has won two fights by kayo at the Bowl, squaring off. Four fast four-round matches, the first beginning at 8:30 p.m., will complete the show.

## Bowl Card To Be 'Surprise'

Hand-picked fighters who have been competing this week in the Southern California Diamond Belt championships at Hollywood Legion arena will be featured tonight in the weekly amateur boxing card at the Wilmington Bowl.

Although unable to reveal a definite man-for-man card, promoter-matchmaker Joe Craig has assured his fight following that he'll come up with another action-packed "club" fight show.

Five of the standout favorites at the Bowl in recent weeks—Freddie Negrete, Tony Grich, Don Turner, Leo Miller and Bill Winger were entered in the Diamond Belt eliminations, and should either or all be eliminated before tonight, they will share the spotlight matches.

## 40-Lap Race At Gilmore

Night speedway midget car racing moves into the seventh month of the 1947 season tonight at Gilmore Stadium, home base of the sport on the Pacific Coast, with the 40-lap Trojan Sweepstakes headlining a card of sprint thrillers, beginning at 8 p.m.

Four more programs remain before the '47 season becomes history with running of the 11th Grand Prix, the 150-lap blue ribbon windup, Thanksgiving nite. Competition this year will be tougher than ever with more fast cars ready than in previous years, and more eastern drivers arriving weekly seeking a "ride" in one of the 32 eligible Grand Prix cars.

Judging from the way the drivers are flying these days, there will be a new set of Gilmore track records before the Grand Prix. For instance, last Thursday night four records were written into the books, Karl Young whizzing one lap in :14.25; Johnny Parsons buzzing the three-lap trophy dash in :43.82; Duke Nelson registering 3:50.75 in the 15-lap semi-main event, and Jerry Piper turning eight laps in 1:59.50.
