J. R. Hitchcock, Santa Fe Head, Dies Suddenly

J. R. Hitchcock, retired general manager of the Santa Fe coast lines and brother of former Councilman James Hitchcock, of Torrance, died Saturday night after a short illness. A life-long railroader, he had begun his career as a messenger in a railway telegraph office, and had served as representative of the Santa Fe and chairman of the general railroad committee which designed and built the Los Angeles Union terminal, long considered a memorial to his wisdom and leadership in railroading.

After a brief period with the Iowa Central Railways in Marshalltown, Ia., he started to work for the Santa Fe in 1890 as a stenographer at isolated San Marcial, N. M. It took him just 15 years to work his way to a superintendent's desk in San Bernardino, and by 1920 he had been named to the assistant general managership of the road's coast lines.

Eight years later he became general manager of the western lines, after which he was transferred to Los Angeles as general manager here. He held that post until his retirement in 1939.

Funeral services for J. R. Hitchcock were held at 3 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 10, in the Church of the Reformation, Forest Lawn, Glendale. He leaves his widow, Mrs. Daisy Conley Hitchcock of 272 S. Irving Blvd.; two sons, H. D. and J. R. Jr.; three daughters, Mrs. James Ingerbretsen, Mrs. E. Jordan Brookes and Miss DeEtta Hitchcock, all of Los Angeles; three brothers, Frank, James and Arthur; two sisters, Mrs. Nell Parrish and Mrs. Bess Hayes, and six grandchildren.

James Hitchcock, and family, have been in Torrance recently handling details of Chanslor-Canfield Midway Oil Company during the absence of Sherwood McIntyre, superintendent here for C.C.M.O.

Enrollment Of Colleges Is Revealed

Total fall enrollment at 22 Los Angeles County colleges and universities was reported at 49,677 today in a Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce education survey.

The largest enrollment was credited to the University of California, with 21,945. University of California at Los Angeles was in second place, with 14,891.

Smallest institution in enrollment, the Chamber reported, was the new Fremont University, 2021 W. 3rd street, with 30 students.

Other enrollment reports were: Loyola, 1,923; George Pepperdine, 1,534; California Institute of Technology, 1,330; Southwestern, 1,279; Occidental, 1,270; Whittier, 1,136; Pomona, 1,116; Pasadena, 750; Mount Saint Mary's, 472; Immaculate Heart, 407; Chapman, 350; College of Medical Evangelists, 305; College of Jewish Studies, 250; La Verne, 244; Scripps, 238; College of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, 233; Los Angeles Pacific, 208; Pacific Coast, 162; and Marymount, 94.


YELLOWSTONE PARK
