### Officers Give Polio Victims Morale Boost

One Torrance mother who is thankful there is a March of Dimes is Mrs. Bille Levesque. Six weeks ago her 12-year-old daughter, Nancy, who had been studying about polio in school came home from her classes and told her mother that she thought her 4-year-old brother, Joey, had contracted the dread disease. A doctor's examination revealed that not only did her little brother have the sickness, but that Nancy too was stricken with the "crippler."

Today, after two weeks at the Los Angeles General Hospital and with administration of the Sister Kenny method of treatment at her home, Mrs. Levesque has her daughter back in regular classes and little Joey in nursery school.

Mrs. Levesque told of receiving a letter from the Infantile Paralysis Foundation that stated that she should notify the foundation if in need of any financial assistance in caring for her children.

Aiding the youngsters' morale were a number of Torrance police officers who visited the pair while they were confined to their home. Among those who visited the Levesque residence at 1916 West 236th street were: Capt. Ernie Ashton, Swayne Johnson,

Larry Benton, Don Clark, Gale Whitacre, Leonard Beal, C. Douglas Cook and Willard Barnett, a former Torrance police officer.

Prompted by the giving of small but important gifts such as empty bullet shells and a real police whistle, the job of exercising the children four times a day and giving hot baths twice a day was lightened for the local homemaker.

Mrs. Levesque is employed at the Hobby Lobby cafe on Cravens avenue.
