The job from 2 to 4 p.m. Dec. 21 and \$687.30 for alleged loss of business.

The complaint additionally charged that Tidwell and the union acted "with malice" and with a "total disregard" of the contract and of the arbitration clause in staging the brief strike.

The \$100,000 requested was for general damages to the company's reputation and relationship with the public and with its customers.

Attorney Ernest W. Pitney, of Los Angeles, filed the complaint which also named as defendants 100 John Does and a John Doe Company.
