Street Lights Discussed at Seaside Meet

Seaside Branch Home Owners Association held its regular monthly meeting Thursday night with a continuation of the discussions on articles of incorporation and street lighting. It was decided that James Hall, attorney, would draw up the necessary legal papers, and copies of by-laws and articles of incorporation would be used to all home owners.

The question of street lighting has developed three alternative methods:

(1) Intersectional lighting, 11 crossroad poles furnished by the city.

(2) Outright purchase by home owners, 33 standards, cost \$1980.

(3) Formation of "Lighting Maintenance District," 33 standards, requires an election and increase in yearly tax bill to pay cost of installation and maintenance.

A recent survey showed that the second plan was the most favorable by almost two to one. There are still a few votes to be received before the members of the city council will be informed so that they will know how to proceed.

Torrance High School will stage its annual variety show with a matinee at 1.30 this afternoon followed by a repeat performance tomorrow evening at 8.

'First Five Years' Subject of Third Lecture-Forum Series

Dr. Howard Wilkening, clinical psychologist, will be the third speaker in a four-lecture forum series being sponsored by Torrance Council, First District PTA and the Evening High School. A topic of the lecture to be presented Tuesday evening, March 29 in the auditorium of Torrance Elementary School, will be, "The First Five Years are the Hardest."

Dr. Wilkening, associate editor of the Journal of Marriage and Family Living, and a member of the board of National Council on Family Relations, is chief clinical psychologist at Orthopedic Hospital, Los Angeles, and heads the psychology department at Los Angeles State College. Prenevost, who purchased the store February 25th, has instituted a complete line of athletic goods, and will also feature team outfitting.




