DARK NIGHT AHEAD FOR TORRANCE

Shadows from this terrestrial globe will black out the Moon April 12 in the first total eclipse of the lunar satellite visible from this area since 1945. Dr. Dinsmore Alter director of the Griffith Park Observatory announced this week.

Incinerators Studied by City Officials

Keeping in mind the fact that Torrance is the "Planned City," City Manager George Stevens and Building Inspector John Patrick last week visited disposal incinerators in two nearby cities.

In conjunction with a meeting of the League of California Cities, they viewed a modern incinerator recently built by Beverly Hills and inspected a plant now under construction in Signal Hill. Looking to the day when Torrance's growing population will necessitate construction of an incinerator, Stevens said that he viewed the building of a plant as the ultimate answer to the city's disposal problem. Trash now is taken to a dump at Western avenue and Plaza Del Amo.

Among the plans under consideration for use here is that Torrance participate in the building of one large plant for use of several municipalities in this area. Although no decisions have been reached, plans have been advanced, at conferences on the proposal, that Torrance, Redondo Beach, Inglewood, Gardena, Hawthorne, Palos Verdes Estates, Hermosa and El Segundo could operate central plant.

Stevens said that he was in favor of suggested handling of the disposal problem by County Sanitation Districts, which would be financed by additional district assessments.


The evening will be devoted to demonstrating the work done in instrumental music in the Torrance Unified School District.
