## Student Music Demonstration Well Received

The music department of Torrance schools last Friday evening presented its second annual instrumental concert and demonstration in the high school auditorium.

Some 250 students from the high school, junior high, Fern Avenue, Torrance Elementary, Perry, and Waverly schools participated.

Meryl Anderson, instructor in the elementary schools, presented her four individual elementary orchestras in one unit. The 75 students, with only one rehearsal together, played as one orchestra.

Abe Milstein, music director for the schools, supervised a demonstration of the sweetwind, song-flute, recorder, and bugle classes. The high school orchestra, also under Milstein's direction, played "Tannhauser March," "España Waltz," and "Dancing in the Dark," demonstrating the orchestras' improvement in the last year.

The junior high school orchestra, under the direction of its instructor, Rudolph Saltzer, also demonstrated its skills. The students' playing technique was well mastered—the string section, bowing as one instrument. Bringing the program to a colorful close, the "Tartar" band offered several selections which reminded the audience of the band's much-lauded performances on the football field last year. The graceful majorettes, Beverly Moore, Ann Olson, and Phyllis Galligan performed baton routines accompanied by the band.

Participation in the concerts has grown from the 17 students in 1947 to the 250 who took part in this year's program.
