## Noted Russian Lecturer Here For Church Talk

Paul Voronaeff, widely known Russian Christian, author and lecturer, returned with his parents who had charge of missionary work in Greece, Turkey, the Balkans and Russia. He lived for 13 years in Communist Russia until he was forced to flee for his life. His mother is now in exile in Siberia and his father is confined to a concentration camp because of their religious work.  
In his talk, Mr. Voronaeff will discuss such questions as: "Is there a religious freedom in Russia today? What is the future of the church in Russia? Is Russia preparing for an early war? Is the Communist dream of 'World Revolution' becoming a reality? What kind of a man is Stalin?"  
The public is cordially invited to hear this timely message of such vital importance. The church is located at Marcelina and Arlington in Torrance.
