Blind Aid Fund Campaign Started


National Brotherhood Days will be observed locally tomorrow and Saturday. The annual drive for funds is directed toward aiding the blind.

Total employment in Los Angeles county increased to 1,601,900 in July of this year, a gain over May, according to the State Department of Employment.

Employment in shipbuilding, non-electric machinery, and wholesale and retail trades was down, but seasonal gains in agriculture, construction and wearing apparel trades offset these losses and established a gain of 6100 employed persons.
