The couple, just returned from their long postponed honeymoon, stopped off at the Ideal Ranch Market, where Betty formerly worked, to visit Gust Drake her stepfather and operator of the market's vegetable department.

Alwyn was still wearing the old steel "banjo splint" which he underwent surgery since his reconstruction more than a month ago. However, he said that he would soon re-enter the hospital to have this splint removed.

The 19-year-old youth was shot in the jaw defending his sweetheart from a lovers' lane attacker in Baldwin Hills last July. Ivers killed the assailant in the ensuing battle. He and his blonde, blue-eyed bride were married two weeks later in a Los Angeles hospital.

The couple said that as soon as "Sonny" receives the doctor's okay, they will return to his home in Oklahoma.

## Enroll Students Early, School Officials Urge

Parents are urged to enroll their children in Torrance Elementary school between Sept. 1 and 12 if they are in this school's attendance area and if their children have not been enrolled previously in Torrance Elementary school according to school officials. Although school does not open until September 12 it is recommended that newcomers enroll prior to the opening date if at all possible.

Children who will be entering the kindergarten for the first time must have reached their fourth birthday by March 1 of this year. First grade enrollees must have been five years of age by March 1, 1949. Birth certificates must be presented at the time of enrollment of all kindergarten and first grade children.

The school will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. for enrollment purposes. Parents wishing to determine if they live in the Torrance Elementary District are urged to call Torrance 3328.
