Torrance City Schools will be presented with an Audiometer, a device to test hearing, at a meeting Monday night at 8 p.m., in St. Cecilia Guild hall of St. Andrew's church.  
 The presentation will be made by the American Legion Auxiliary on behalf of the many organizations donating to the fund and will be accepted by Dr. Howard A. Wood, president of the Torrance City Board of Education.  
 The American Legion Auxiliary sponsored the drive to raise the fund for purchase of the device which will result in considerable aid to school children who are unwittingly being held back in their studies due to deafness.


**DELPHIAN MEMBERS TO MEET TODAY IN CITY LIBRARY**

**EL CAMINO WILL OCCUPY NEW CAMPUS MARCH 15**

El Camino College is scheduled to move to its new campus on Alondra park on March 15, Forrest G. Murdock, president, told the Torrance Herald Monday.  
 Rapid progress is being made on a series of nine buildings of temporary nature, some being converted from former Army classrooms and others being built of new materials.  
 The college will have a capacity of 2000 students, by rotating class schedules throughout the day and evening, President Murdock said. The 34 classrooms now being provided in the nine buildings will have a capacity of 1200 students at one time. This is the approximate enrollment in El Camino at this time, but it is expected to jump considerably as soon as day classes start. The college now is on an afternoon and evening schedule at Leuzinger High School.  
 The nine buildings are being arranged in typical "campus" manner, but they can be moved to other locations on the 89 acre campus acquired from the County of Los Angeles on a deal whereby the county will spend back on the athletic plant of the college the \$1,000 an acre the college district will pay for the land.  
 Building A contains a library, cafeteria, student store, one classroom and administrative offices. Building B contains 10 classrooms and the others contain three classrooms each with the exception of the music building which will contain but one room.  
 Reconstruction cost is about \$6.00 a square foot, at this point, it was said, and the bill will run up to about \$127,000 on the Army buildings. New construction is costing \$7.00 a square foot, with a total expenditure of some \$140,000 contemplated for this type of structure. They will satisfactorily serve the college for from five to 10 years, if necessary, while the college is building the big \$2,500,000 campus being paid for on a "pay as you go" basis by a 25 cent extra tax voted last year by people of the district. The tax is for five years.  
 The temporary structures will be painted sage green with an oyster white trim.  
 Sewer and water may cost the district \$38,000, making a total investment of \$305,000 this year.  
 An athletic field is to be graded as soon as drainage surveys are completed, and it will be planted with grass.  
 The college is located on the Torrance city line at Redondo
