Six Democratic party delegates and alternates from the harbor area are included among the 124 men and women who will represent the state at the party convention in July in Philadelphia.



State Housing Act Made Ready For '48 Ballot

California voters will have a chance to tackle the housing problem at the November elections if an initiative petition filed with the Attorney General secures the necessary signatures to give it a place on the ballot.

The measure is sponsored by the California Housing Initiative Committee, of which Msgr. Thomas J. O'Dwyer of Los Angeles is chairman. It was placed before Howser by Harold F. Wise, State Director of the committee.

The initiative proposes to the voters that the state constitution be amended to create a State Housing Agency and equip it with authority and funds to assist local housing authorities and non-profit housing associations in the development and operation of low rent and moderate rent dwellings.

The committee sponsoring the measure reported that it already had secured the endorsement of the executive committee of the California State Federation of Labor, various posts of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion and the American Veterans' Committee, and civic and housing groups in many parts of the state.

Effective Date Of Rent Hikes Is Explained

Increases in maximum rents authorized by local Rent Offices to individual landlords will take effect on the date the landlord filed a petition for adjustment, Housing Expediter Tighe E. Woods announced today.

This change in the Rent Regulations which took effect Jan. 30 applies to individual adjustments authorized by the Office of Rent Control under any of the 15 grounds listed in the regulations. Previously, the rent increase became effective on the date the official order authorizing a higher rent was issued by the Area Rent Office.

Woods explained that the action making the rent increase retroactive was taken in order to compensate landlords promptly for higher rentals for which they qualify. Any delay by a rent office in processing a petition will not penalize an owner by deferring the date when he is authorized to charge a higher rent, he said.

Among the more important grounds listed in the Rent Regulations to petition for individual rent increases are major capital improvements, substantial increase in space, services, furniture, furnishings or equipment; special relationship between landlord and the tenant occupying the accommodations on the freeze date; substantial increase in occupancy; peculiar circumstances or inequitable rent; substantial hardship caused by increased taxes or operating costs.
