COLUMBIA GRAND OPERA QUARTET HERE FEB. 25

A combination of superbly trained voices which have won acclaim from audiences and critics all over the country—that description belongs to the Columbia Grand Opera Quartet appearing in the Torrance High School Auditorium here on Feb. 25 at 8:15 p.m.

Adhering to "ladies first"—the feminine side of the quartet is composed of Edna Phillips, brilliant young coloratura soprano, who stepped from her desk as head billing clerk to star billing as soloist with Toscanini, and Helen Olheim, noted mezzo-soprano. Born in Fall River, Mass., Miss Phillips attended the Sacred Heart Convent. After studying with Germaine Barre in her home town and at Boston's New England Conservatory, she came to New York to work with Paul Althouse while during the day she was employed in an office. Her radio debut over the NBC network was such a success she was immediately reengaged for a long series of performances on the air. The following spring she auditioned for Toscanini's radio program of Gluck's opera, "Orfeo," and won the rare opportunity to sing "The Happy Spirit"—which indeed she was. Her success now increases with each appearance she makes as concert artist and radio star.

A favorite American singer, Helen Olheim brings the best in operatic traditions to the Columbia Grand Opera Quartet. For ten seasons one of the Metropolitan Opera's busiest and most popular artists, her every performance is a masterpiece of fine artistry. Her Malika to Lily Pons' "Lakme," her sympathetic Suzuki in "Madame Butterfly," her sprightly Siebel in "Faust," her joyous Hansel and Gretel, these and many other roles have endeared her to a wide public. Numerous network broadcasts and Victor recordings have spread her fame nationwide. This popular artist was born in Buffalo and was graduated from the Eastman School of Music. A member of the Columbia Grand Opera Quartet since its inception, Helen Olheim brings to her part the authority of a rich and varied experience.


Perry Group Visits Farm
