History Exhibit Opens At L.A. County Museum

Scores of interesting documents and historical relics which played an important part in the early history of the United States, an exhibit closely related to the one carried on the Freedom Train, have been set up in the Los Angeles County Museum in Exposition Park.

The exhibit, which marks the beginning of a permanent American History Exhibit at the Museum, was opened to the public on Saturday, Feb. 21.

In the Museum's collection are original official papers signed by Washington and other early presidents of the United States, also by Abraham Lincoln; original letters and documents; photographs and letters of Susan B. Anthony. Also original copies of newspapers carrying the death stories of Washington and Lincoln.

Some of the things in the collection of historical relics are an old leather top hat once owned by President Lincoln; chairs, candlesticks and a Masonic apron that belonged to Washington; a sword once carried by John Paul Jones; clothes worn by Thomas Jefferson; and many other interesting and valuable reminders of the men and women who helped to build up a free America.

Taxpayers 'Platform' Is Offered

"Platform" for taxpayers adopted at the 22nd annual meeting of California Taxpayers' Association, in Los Angeles, Tuesday morning, Feb. 24, at the Biltmore hotel, included recommendations that:

1. Proposed bond issues be turned down unless need is imperative.
 2. Demands for further inflation of public payrolls be denied.
 3. Liberalization of public charity and relief be halted.
 4. Consolidation of small, un-economical governmental units be fostered.
 5. Further handouts from Sacramento and Washington be stopped.
 6. New governmental units be established only as a last resort.
 7. Construction of all but the most necessary public projects be postponed.
 8. "Surplus" public employees, particularly Federal, be returned to private life.
 9. Propaganda of public spending groups be vigorously counter-attacked.
 10. Taxes and spending by every government unit be held to a minimum and, wherever possible, reduced, to leave more money in the pockets of the people.
 11. Every citizen step up his tax consciousness—register and vote.
- "Only the most informed, aggressive, and patriotic action by Americans can save the United States from socialization by taxation," declared Lane D. Webber, of Los Angeles, vice president of the Southern California Edison company, speaking to his subject, "Socialization by Taxation."
- "The filing fingers of taxation reach out at the unborn baby. They clutch at him thru-out his life and, like ghouls, desecrate his final resting place," Webber continued.
- "The direct impact of taxation—as approximating one-third of the national income—is bad enough.
- "But there is something far more sinister in the movement to keep government spending high. It is the effect on the philosophy of government, of society, of humanity, of freedom."

OVERSEAS JOBS OFFERED YOUNG AND SINGLE MEN

Mrs. Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance office of the California State Employment Service, stated that many employment opportunities overseas are available for men between the ages of 21 and 45. There is an urgent need for skilled workers such as carpenters, boiler-makers, pipefitters, riggers, diesel mechanics, machinists, painters, refrigeration mechanics, masons, and male stenographers. The jobs are located in the South Pacific, Arabia, South America and other foreign countries. Experience requirements are five to 10 years as journeymen or foremen. Age requirements for South America are 28 to 38.

Mrs. Ellis further stated that the Department of State of the United States Government is anxious to receive applications from highly qualified individuals to fill some of the vacancies that exist in the foreign service clerical group. A recruiter for the State Department is in the Los Angeles Commercial and Professional office of the California State Employment Service.

MOUNTAIN STATES AND WYOMING TO HAVE PICNICS



Only Full Time Vet Students Get Increases

Approximately 125,000 veterans in the Veterans Administration Branch 12 area (California, Arizona, Nevada and Hawaii) who are pursuing full-time courses in schools, colleges and universities will be entitled to increased subsistence allowances, Colonel Thomas J. Cross, Branch 12 VA chief, announced today.

Only veterans pursuing full-time educational courses will be entitled to the increased subsistence allowances under the new law signed Saturday by President Truman which amended both the Servicemen's Readjustment Act (G.I. Bill) and the Vocational Rehabilitation Act for disabled veterans.

Part-time students, on-the-job, and institutional-on-farm trainees and others will not be entitled to the increases, Colonel Cross said.

The new payments will be at the monthly rate of \$75 a month for a veteran without dependents, \$105 a month for a veteran with one dependent, and \$120 for a veteran with more than one dependent.

The higher rates are applicable to periods of training on and after April 1. However, since subsistence allowance checks are not due until the end of the month in which the veteran is in training, most of the eligible veteran-students will receive their first checks at the higher rates on or shortly after May 1.


