Water District Officers Chosen In Nearby Areas

Only 3591 votes were cast Tuesday in the election of five candidates to the Board of Directors of the West Basin Municipal Water District. More than 14,000 voters went to the polls to form the district on Nov. 25, but the total number of ballots last Tuesday represented only a little more than 10 percent of the electorate.

In Division 1, the "semi-official" returns showed a total of 344 ballots cast with 343 persons voting for W. C. Farquhar, the lone candidate. In the five Lomita Division precincts, only 241 persons showed up at the polling places, the remaining district votes coming from Palos Verdes Estates and Watson Junction.

R. W. Pritchard, of Redondo Beach, with the backing of the local Committee for West Basin Water, defeated James P. Irons for the Division 2 directorship by a margin of 979 votes against 468 for the only contested post. A total of 1,449 persons went to the polls in Division 2, which includes Redondo Beach, Clifton, El Nido and Victor.

Robert E. Austin was elected in Division 3 (Manhattan Beach and Hermosa Beach) polling 856 votes out of a total of 922 cast.

Division 4, which encompasses El Segundo and Wiseburn, sent lone candidate R. T. Hutchins to the Board with 375 out of 381 votes.

August H. Riess will represent Lennox, Lawndale, Howard and Moneta (Division 5) with 490 votes from 495 ballots cast.

The votes will be canvassed and the official results announced in about 10 days.

The five-man Board of Directors will play a major part in shaping the policy of the newly formed West Basin Municipal Water district.

Stephenson, exalted ruler of the 1942 lodge, and Byron L. Livingston, past exalted ruler. Guests included El Camino president, Forrest G. Murdock; H. J. Sheffield, El Camino director of student personnel; Vern J. Rice, principal of Leuzinger High

School; Kenneth M. Hurlbert, principal of Inglewood High School; and J. L. Abbott, principal of Washington High School.

At the luncheon, President Murdock praised the lodge for being the first organization to offer such a plan to the new El Camino College.


