1. He watches the minute details of completing the gigantic building project, preparing to move into new offices from temporary structures.

2. He makes a flying trip to Chandler, Ariz., to welcome a new grandson.

3. He is constantly on the alert for a home so that he can become a resident of the city.

The man we are talking about is H. W. Creeger, who is in charge of the Torrance poetry of American Radiator and Standard Sanitary Corp., nearing completion on Crenshaw boulevard and 203rd street.






