### 'Missing' Zamperini Back In U.S. From Mexico Tour

With tales of two-foot-in-diameter boa constrictors, and a wild stormy night at sea, Louis Zamperini, former Torrance track star, flew back to the United States Tuesday after a five-week cruise in Mexican waters.

A storm at sea that caused a rudder pin to snap delayed for a day "The Flyaway" and her crew of eight in reaching one of the ports-of-call and caused a brief search by the Coast Guard to find the "missing" 60-foot schooner.

Zamperini returned when his wife, Cynthia, wired him that pressure of his importing and war salvage business made it necessary for him to cut short his cruise. Louis, a former bombardier who survived 47 days on a life raft and three years in a Jap prison camp, plans to open a branch office in Honolulu with his partners, Jose Caseres and Bill Quinn, two former U.S.C. school mates. Caseres is at present in charge of all athletics in the Republic of San Salvador.

The former mile champion told of visiting Marie Madre Island, the Alcatraz of Mexico, where prisoners are given the run of the island and live in and own better homes than their free next-door neighbors. For killing a man in Mexico a prisoner is sentenced to 30 years whereas if he kills a man in prison his term is extended for 2½ years, Zamperini said.
