## Palos Verdes Links Prep For So. Calif. Tourney

One of the greatest golf tournaments ever attempted by any course south of the Metropolitan area, will be staged June 4, 5, and 6 at Palos Verdes Country Club. The Hillside Links will be host to the 49th Annual Southern California tournament, one of the oldest annual events in California history.

First step in preparation for the golf classic was taken last week-end when more than 200 members staged a clean-up day that resulted in more than 10 ton of debris being hauled away or burned.

Some of the finest shotmakers in golf are expected to enter the Pee Vee event as many of the nation's top ranking players will be in this vicinity in preparation for the National Open to be staged the following week-end in Los Angeles.

The Palos Verdes tourney will have a total value of \$2500 with \$500 expected as top prize. Already entered are Tony Penna and Tommy Armour of national fame, while every ranking member of the Southern California P.G.A. and amateur circle will play.

More than 200 players will tee off in the 72-hole event with the field being reduced on Friday and Saturday evenings.

Season tickets for the three days still are being sold at the club and at all Southern California courses. The price for advance tickets for three days will be the same as that for a single day when actual play begins.

Harry Croft, club president and N. Y. Jordahl, tournament chairman, predicted that record-breaking crowds would be

on hand for each day of the tournament with Sunday's 36-holes to draw a capacity gallery.

Ray Sleppy of Torrance, who is assisting in arranging the event and who will be among the amateur entries, said word is expected early next week from the P.G.A. tournament director with the names of many other competitors.


