### Horn-tails Working On Plants, Roses

If the tip six inches of some of your berry plants are wilting suddenly, raspberry horn-tails are attacking the canes. Said the Agriculture Extension Service. They also attack roses. As there is no effective spray, cut the tip off six inches below any wilting and burn it.

The injury is caused by a worm that hatches from an egg laid by a fly. The worm burrows into the stem and works under the outer bark. If you peel the bark carefully, you will find its spiral tunnel circling downward around the stem.
