16ers Cop Three Games During Full Week-end

A very busy and successful weekend was put in by the Torrance Optimist Club's 16ers softball team who spent Saturday and Sunday afternoon in polishing off three worthy opponents.

Victor Ordaz played the iron man role by pitching all three games. Manhattan Beach Boys Club were the first victims, losing 7-4 in their own pasture, in a regularly scheduled game in the South Bay Junior Athletic League. Jimmie Nady, third sacker for the winners, collected a pair of hits in three tries and his performance was duplicated by Bill Bradshaw, the loser's first baseman.

In the afternoon the team returned to the Torrance City Park diamond where they met and defeated a fine team from the Optimist Boys Home of Los Angeles, by a 3-0 score. Ordaz played a prominent role in the victory by driving in two runs with a double in the first inning, leading the batting attack with 2 for 3 and setting the opposition down with three hits in the five innings he was in the game. He was relieved in the sixth by catcher Frank Schmidt who allowed two hits, both in the final inning.

Elio Clemente, third baseman, led the visitors at bat, getting two for three. George Gilber, visiting pitcher, looked good on the rubber while losing. He also slapped a triple off of Schmidt in the seventh. Fauster Madariaga, coach for the Boys Home team, said that the loss was the first for his club this season, in 12 starts. However, in fairness to the team, several of their regular players were absent because of other assignments. Tentative arrangements have been made for a return game here under the lights on June 22nd. Coach Fauster has served notice on the local lads to be ready to take a licking should the game materialize. He also stated that his team is currently playing in the finals of the Los Angeles City Championships, and that they were highly confident of winning the title in their division.

On Sunday, Ray Richhart took the team to Alhambra park in Cal Blakesley's truck to play the Lawndale Optimist Club boy's team. Ray, however, ran into a schedule mix-up. (Three teams being present.) By mutual consent the locals met and defeated, by a 7-2 score, the Beth Wood boys team, last year's champions and this year's league leaders in the Culver City league for 16-year olds. The Lawndale game will be played next Sunday in Torrance, at 2 p.m. on the Fern Avenue Park diamond.

Ordaz set the Culver City nine back on their heels with a two-run homer in the third, limited them to three hits and would have registered a shut-out but for a fluke homer in the second frame. Culver's leftfielder, Wilson, had led off with a walk when shortstop Elliott's line single took a freak hop past Bill Crawford in left field for a home run. Local players led in the hitting department. Catcher Frank Schmidt with two for three and Ordaz's two for four.
