

Gas' Gallonage Up 9 Per Cent, State Reports

An increase of nearly nine per cent in total gallonage of gasoline distributed in April, as compared to the same period a year ago, brought tax revenues of \$9,985,776 to the State motor vehicle fuel fund, according to the State Board of Equalization. Taxable total of 259,083,095 gallons of gasoline distributed in April was slightly lower than the amount distributed in March, 1948, but nevertheless set a new high record for any April in the history of the motor vehicle fuel tax. Net revenues exceeded those of April, 1947, by 59 per cent because of the increased gasoline distributions and the change in the rate of tax from three to four and a half cents per gallon which became effective in July, 1947.

\$53,000 Suit Filed Over Oil Well Injury

Damages totaling \$53,000 are sought for the injuries his seven-year-old boy received when caught in the gears of a Torrance oil well pump, in a civil action on file today in Los Angeles county superior court on behalf of K. Motoyasu.

The parent charged that the Superior Oil Company installed the attractive blue pump at Sepulveda boulevard and Normandie avenue near the boy's home at 1504 Sepulveda boulevard, without fencing in the machinery. The boy, attracted to the pump, got caught in the powerful gears and his left leg and thigh were crushed and severely lacerated, crippling him permanently, the complaint alleges.

L.B.'s Pike Plans Show for 'Fourth'


Mason Kight, new manager of the Long Beach Bath House Properties, announced today that in keeping with their policy of improving the Pike, new

Use Almond Mixture for New Recipes

An almond powdered sugar mixture for making cookies, milk-shakes, candies, frostings and cake fillings has been perfected by University of California College of Agriculture food technologists. Shelled almonds are peeled by soaking them in hot water until the skins loosen. Grind the almonds medium fine in a kitchen-size food grinder. Then mix 12 ounces of ground almonds with 7 1/4 ounces of powdered sugar. Regrind this mixture through the food chopper, using the nut butter attachment. Now add 14 ounces more of powdered sugar, mix well and regrind again. The men made macaroons using 5 ounces of powder, 1 egg white and a few drops of almond extract. Their recipe: beat the egg white until stiff, stir well and bake at 350-375 degrees. For a rich milkshake, just mix the powder with whole milk, or add a little honey or table syrup to a cupful of powder, mix well and use it to make foundation-type candy. Mix the powder with whipped egg white or syrup, plus water if needed, for frostings and cake fillings.


