Welfare Group Reviews Work of Past Year

Increased team-work between public agencies and the Welfare Council of Metropolitan Los Angeles, aimed at improved services for the community, highlighted the past 12 months work of the organization, according to C. W. Pfeiffer, executive secretary, who spoke at the annual meeting.

Achievements of the Council and agencies during the past year included legislative support of the Child Care Center program, provisions for the proper licensing for foster homes and institutions for the aged, opposition to cuts in standards of aid to needy children, support of a 15 per cent increase in the local budget for general relief and the creation of a county-wide study on the problems of the aged.

In addition Pfeiffer declared that the Council has established a definite set of standards for operation of the Welfare Centers, which will bring maximum Community Chest agency services to the residents of towns and cities in the Metropolitan area. The First District Welfare Center located at 1139 Post avenue, serves people in the Lomita-Torrance district.
