Information on Farm Units for Veterans Given

J. G. Caldwell, of the Veterans Service Center in Torrance, announced that 529 individual farm units in the west will be opened to veterans in the very near future for homesteading. The land includes 86 farms in the Tule Lake division of the Klamath project in California and Oregon; 16 farms in the Roza division of the Yakima project in Washington; 75 farms in the Yuma Mesa division of the Gila project in Arizona; 40 farms in the Fayette division of the Gila project in Idaho; 16 farms in the Gooding division of the Minidoka project in Idaho; 77 farms in the Heart Mountain division of the Shoshone project in Wyoming; and 210 farms in the Riverton division of the Wyoming project. Application forms and additional information will be supplied by the Service Center, 1339 Post Avenue, about August 1, 1948.

More Sinking in Harbor Area Now Predicted

Future sinking of land equal to that which has already occurred in the harbor area is predicted in a report of the technical committee of the board of harbor commissioners. The area near Southern California Edison plant on Terminal Island has already sunk eight feet, according to the report, and another eight feet of sludge can be expected. Land is now sinking at the rate of one foot a year. The subsidence fans out from the Edison plant through the harbor district as far as Pine Avenue in Long Beach, but no explanation for it was offered in the report.
