
CLEALAND C. CONVERSE

Shipyard Near Steel Mill Now Set to Re-Open

Re-opening of the Western Pipe and Steel Company's shipbuilding yards in Wilmington was announced by William Costa, a San Diego inventor.

The announcement follows inauguration of the new "mill point" system of pricing steel. Costa is backed by a \$2,000,000 company. The inventor, who has a new-type power unit for propelling ships, said he hopes to start hiring key personnel within the next few weeks.

Three hundred persons would be initially employed. Costa said his invention is a ship propulsion unit based on the idea of detachable power units underneath the ship.

His company, known as the Bilco Shipbuilding Company, would convert Liberty ships to the propulsion unit and thus allow them to compete with fast foreign merchantmen.
