Crenshaw and Cabrillo Work Is Completed

Improvement of Crenshaw boulevard between 203rd street and 190th street, and the improvement of a section of Cabrillo avenue south of the business district was accepted this week by the city council.

Lt. Marshall J. Loftus, a member of the 524th Fighter Squadron stationed at Kearney, Neb., flew an F-51 in the Air Armada Saturday July 31 at the dedication of the Idlewild Airport, New York.

The 522nd, 523rd and 524th squadrons of the 27th wing stationed at KAFB rendezvous in their F-51's and P-52's at Grenier Field, N. H., and from there made their run over Idlewild. It was the first presidential review of the nation's air power in history.

City To Open Radio, Street Sweeper Bids

Bids for re-equipping the Torrance Police radio facilities and for a pickup sweeper will be opened on Tuesday Aug. 10, pursuant to an order of the City Council.

The radio equipment to be replaced will consist of nine portable transmitting and receiving sets for installation in patrol cars as well as a main station transmitter and receiver.

The pickup sweeper is to have a sweeping width of six feet, two cubic yard hopper capacity, mechanical controls for lifting and lowering the broom and for dumping, and be designed for short turns.

Court Rules Against Retail Clerks Union

Recommendations take effect as a board order, enforceable in U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals, unless contested by one of the parties within 20 days. Greenberg recommended dismissal of two charges, holding that the union's demand for a closed shop violated two other sections of the act.

Similar cases are pending before the NLRB for 12 other harbor district stores. The NLRB hearing on unfair labor charges climaxed efforts of the San Pedro Business Men Association to negotiate a contract with the union to replace one which expired last Jan. 30. Subsequent negotiations resulted in an agreement announced July 7 in both Torrance and San Pedro.
