FOR A COOL FINISH
For a cool finish to a hot weather meal, serve a dessert that's been chilled or frozen in your refrigerator. If the rest of the food is on the hearty side, make it a rosy wedge of watermelon or a golden bowl of cantaloupe.

To finish a light meal or for company, an ice cream specialty makes a fine selection. Here are a few tested recipes for desserts that are sure to please.

BANANA SUPREME
24 marshmallows
1/4 C. pineapple juice
3 ripe bananas, thinly sliced
3 Tbsp. crushed pineapple
1 C. whipping cream
Lady fingers or thin slices of sponge cake
Set cold control to coldest position awhile before putting dessert to freeze. Return to normal setting about an hour after the dessert has been put in. Heat marshmallows and pineapple juice over simmer flame until marshmallows are melted. Cool. Add bananas and pineapple. Fold in cream which has been whipped until thick but not stiff. Line bottom of freezing tray with lady fingers or slices of sponge cake placed close together. Cover with marshmallow mixture and freeze in refrigerator. Serve in slices cut 1/2 inch thick. Garnish with additional whipped cream and sliced bananas.

FROZEN LEMON PIE
2 eggs, separated
1/2 C. sugar
1/2 C. lemon juice
1 tsp. grated lemon rind
1 C. whipping cream
1/2 C. cooky, graham cracker, or cake crumbs
Set refrigerator control to coldest position. Beat egg yolks in top of double boiler. Add all but 1 Tbsp. of sugar, lemon juice and rind. Cook until thickened, stirring constantly. Cool. Beat egg whites until frothy, then add remaining sugar and beat till peaks form. Fold whites and whipped cream in. To custard. Butter refrigerator tray and sprinkle with half of crumbs. Pour in lemon mixture and sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Place in freezing unit. To serve cut across tray diagonally to make ple-shaped pieces.

FROZEN ROCKY ROAD
1 square unsweetened chocolate
1/4 C. milk
1 Tbsp. sugar
1 tsp. gelatin
1/4 C. chopped pecans
1/4 marshmallows
1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 pint whipping cream
1 Tbsp. water
Set cold control to coldest position. Cook sugar, milk and chocolate until thick and smooth, stirring constantly. Add gelatin which has been dissolved in 1 Tbsp. water. Cool. Add marshmallows cut in quarters, nuts and vanilla. Fold in whipped cream. Pour into dessert tray and freeze. Return cold control to normal setting when dessert is partly frozen.

LEMON ICE CREAM
1 C. sugar
0 Tbsp. flour
1 C. water
2 eggs
1 Tbsp. butter
1 C. whipping cream
Juice and rind of 2 lemons
Few grains salt
Set cold control to coldest position. Mix sugar, salt and flour, add water and cook until clear and smooth, stirring constantly. Add beaten eggs and butter and cook until mixture thickens. Cool. Fold in beaten egg whites, whipped cream, lemon juice and rind. Pour into dessert tray of refrigerator and freeze. Return cold control to normal setting when dessert is partly frozen.

DELUXE ICE CREAM DESSERT
1-1/2 pts. vanilla ice cream
1/4 C. margarine
1/2 C. chocolate cookie crumbs
1/4 C. sugar
Set refrigerator control to coldest position. Prepare vanilla ice cream or purchase 1 pint. To make crumbs, roll thin chocolate wafers with rolling pin. Cream margarine, add crumbs and sugar; blend thoroughly. Pack half the crumb mixture in freezing tray and place in refrigerator to chill. Cover crumbs with ice cream, packing it down well. Press remaining crumbs firmly on top. Return to refrigerator to freeze.

Sound Picture to Be Shown Judge Shidler Takes Bench at San Pedro

A 16 mm. sound motion picture entitled "Beyond Our Own", will be shown at El Nido Community church, 182nd st., Sunday, Aug. 29 at 7:30 o'clock. Also shown will be a short picture on missionary work in Shanghai, and a beautiful hymn tune "Rock of Ages."
