Authorities Warn Deer Hunters of Season's Ending

While serving official notice that California's 1948 deer hunting season ends at one-half hour after sunset Friday, Oct. 15, the Division of Fish and Game has issued a reminder to successful hunters that deer tags should be properly validated and forwarded to the San Francisco office.

No more than one in six of the State's estimated 300,000 deer hunters will report a successful season, says Assistant Chief Ben Glading of the Bureau of Game Conservation. On this basis, approximately 50,000 deer tags will be turned in for the 1948 season. Last year's total reported kill was 47,178.

Returned tags provide an accurate tape measure in estimating deer populations, establishing or abolishing refuges, and in setting future open seasons, Glading states.

Game biologists have found a herd of approximately 10 deer necessary to place one legal buck in the hunter's bag. If 50,000 tags are turned in this year, California's deer population can be pegged at a minimum of 500,000 head.

If tags show an excessive deer kill in specific areas, the Division must investigate the possibilities of further management practices. Several refuges were opened to hunting during the 1947 season when herds were considered too large for the amount of deer forage in the area.

Like Catching Fish Better Than Eating It? Try These

With an estimated half million trout anglers afield this summer, the Division of Fish and Game has brought forth the following official versions of a tempting trout dinner.

Broiled Trout and Bacon
Clean trout, wash well and dry on a towel or napkin. Season with salt and pepper, roll in oil, and broil. When done, put on a platter with maitre d'hotel sauce. Lay six slices of bacon on top. Garnish with quartered lemons and parsley in branches.

Baked Trout
Rub the fish generously inside and outside with salt. If dressing is used, fill and sew up with a string. With or without dressing tie the trout in a semi-circle or in the shape of an "S." An oiled cheesecloth placed under

the fish makes it easier to remove to a platter.
Brush with oil and place in a hot oven for ten minutes, then reduce the temperature for additional baking, allowing ten minutes for the first four pounds and five for each additional pound.

Remove string, being careful not to tear the fish. Serve on a hot platter with drawn butter sauce made by melting four tablespoons of butter in which two table-spoonful of flour, one-quarter teaspoon of salt and a few grains of pepper have been mixed. Stir until smooth and cook until bubbling and then stir in gradually one cupful of hot water or fish stock. Cook, stirring constantly until smooth and thick. Pour over fish and serve at once.

Awards Made on Bleachers and Lighting

Formal award of contracts calling for construction work totaling \$48,000 on new wood bleachers, a lighting system and relocation of the track on the high school athletic field was made at a special meeting of the Board of Education Tuesday night.

C. B. Bagnall, local general contractor, was given the contract, and it is understood that sub-contract work also will be let locally.

School officials said budget funds were not sufficient to construct more than four-fifths of the bleachers planned on the north side of the field, but that these can be added later.

The work will include more ticket booths, black top surfacing on walks leading to the stands, and fencing to control the crowds. Completion will be delayed until around the end of the year, it was estimated.

A high percentage of immature bucks reported taken in Butte county several years ago prompted the Division to order an emergency closing of the area to protect the remaining deer. "In the velvet" reports indicated the season was set too early.

Jayvees Trounce Jordan, 46-0!

Greg James led the locals scoring with two touchdowns and conversions. Dave Bishop and Chuck Henry also romped over the goal line twice.

The outstanding play of the game came in the third quarter when Boyd Crawford took the ball on his own 20 yard marker and ran through the entire Panther team for an 80 yard touchdown tally. The final two points came with a safety in the last quarter.

A game with the Inglewood Jayvee team will be scheduled for next week.


