Tartars 'Feel Bad' after 20-6 Beating by Samohi and 'Bobo'

The Tartar Varsity was licking its wounds (five of them) this week after engaging in a nerve-racking and body-wrecking contest against Santa Monica, defending C.I.F. champs, last Saturday night on the opponents' field. "Bobo" Lewis, dusky Samohi scabbard, aided by four strings of Santa Monica players, defeated Torrance, 20-6 to hand the Tartars their second defeat in three Bay League games.

In spite of the unbalanced score, Torrance played a fair game of ball—as the statistics indicate. Torrance lagged on net yards gained from running plays by 61 yards. Lewis, on two plays, ran up Santa Monica's total yardage by 120 yards.

In first downs Torrance outplayed Santa Monica, 11-7. On a very wet and thick turf fumbles occurred on the average of one every five minutes. Each club dropped the ball six times, but all 12 were recovered by Torrance. The Tartars lost no yards from penalties during the entire contest, while Samohi lost 65 yards on setbacks.

Not less than five Tartars received injuries during the game. Most serious occurred to Co-captain Milo Goetsch, who banged up an early season shoulder injury. He will be out of play for at least a week. The other four on the list are expected to be in shape for the Beverly Hills game on Friday. These include Onal Harris with a knee injury, Rano Sullivan and Buddy Licht with bad "charlie horses," and Jim Taylor with a sprained thumb.

While the entire Santa Monica team aided in building up the Torrance injured list, it was mostly "Bobo" Lewis who did a fine job of needling the fans.

In the second quarter "Bobo" broke off right tackle and brought the fans to their feet while he raced Gil Avalos down to the one-yard line where Avalos brought him down. The run was good for 69 yards. On the next play Fullback Allie Bandura went over. Lewis, running

the try for the extra point, was held.

The half ended with Torrance recovering one of the dozen fumbles of the evening on Santa Monica's one-half yard line. As they raced up to the line of scrimmage the gun ended the half. Quarterback Dick Turner had called time but was refused by the referee because Torrance had already had its limit of timeouts, it was claimed.

Samohi's second tally was a repeat performance of the first, with "Bobo" going over right tackle for a run of 51 yards. He added the points by running.

Torrance came back in the fourth period to score after a set-up pass from Turner to Jim Webb who was downed on the 12. A penalty against S. M. brought the ball into play from the five, from where Jack Taylor took it down to the two. Turner pushed it to the half-yard marker (if there is such a marker). Taylor went over, Turner's kick was wide.

It looked as if Torrance was back in the ball game for a moment, but only until Jerry Harris heaved a 29-yard pass over the heads of the Tartars' defensive backs. Larry Neal, Santa Monica's star of last year, in his first game of the 1948 season nabbed the pass and added six points. A running try for the conversion made the score 20-6.




