

Mrs. Elsie Guenther, international representative from the home office of the sorority in Kansas City, Mo., will read the impressive service and confer the pledge degree. She will be assisted by Mrs. Frank Lane, former member from Kokomo, Indiana, and Miss Verna Porter, former member from Denver, Colorado.

Officers will be installed and a business meeting will follow to determine the meeting dates of the chapter.

Mrs. Frank Lane is to be installed as director, and Mrs. Willis Brooks as social sponsor.

Founded in 1939, the sorority has grown into the largest of its kind in the world, having nearly 3000 chapters in every one of the states, every province of Canada, the territories of Alaska and Hawaii, and the countries of England and Scotland. It has 80,000 members. California has 165 chapters, 31 of which are in Los Angeles, six in Long Beach, two in San

Pedro, two in Lynwood, one in Compton and one in Inglewood. Founded in 1939 as a cultural, educational and social sorority for young women, it gives to its members a workable method of acquiring and exchanging ideals and ideas, by uniting in fellowship those who have a definite desire to develop their cultural natures by definite courses of study. It gives them splendid new friendships through participation in chapter activities, councils and conventions, as well as activities in civic and national projects of all kinds.

The sorority sponsors several planned tours a year under the capable direction of its official travel counsellor, Mrs. Melita O'Hara of Seattle, Washington. Rambles to Hawaii, Mexico, Canada, England, and the recent ones to the Mardi Gras in New Orleans and to Sun Valley, Idaho, have been enjoyed by many of its members.

Through its magazine, "The Torch," contests in creative arts are sponsored annually, among them being short story writing, poetry, song writing and the exciting one of finding the prettiest girl of the organization for its valentine.

The South Bay branch of the National Fuchsia Society of America met at Grant Community Hall, Redondo Beach, for the monthly regular meeting.


Mrs. M. M. Cornbleth, president, greeted members and guests and explained the absence of some of the officers of the club.

Guests present included Misses. Harry Stevens of Inglewood, V. Winkelbauer, 2009C Cabrillo mother of the bride, Edward


