Next Tuesday, Nov. 9 the Parent-Teacher Association of Torrance Elementary school is having a pot luck dinner and meeting at the high school gymnasium. This gathering will enable parents to visit the classrooms and see the newly-equipped home economics rooms and the general shops.

Walteria Elementary school has set special times for parents to visit classes, from kindergarten through the sixth grade, although they may also come at various times during the entire week. Morning classes will have special programs and activities on Wednesday between 10 and 11 a.m.

Regular classes will also have an hour between 10 and 11 a.m. The afternoon classes will have a special hour between 2 and 3 p.m. for their programs on Wednesday.

At Fern avenue school, parents and friends will be given an opportunity to visit classrooms and discuss the work of their children with the teacher. On Friday night, Nov. 12, a special program will be presented by the Parent-Teacher Association in the school auditorium.

Topic for discussion at this meeting will be "Teaching Subjects or Teaching Children," the audience is invited to participate in the discussion, or they may ask questions and receive answers from faculty members of the discussion leader, Walter Rehbold.
