Employment in Industries at New Peak

Four manufacturing industries in California established new employment records in September. Total employment in non-durable goods manufacturing was at an all-time high and in durable goods was at the highest level since the war.

Apparel, printing and publishing, lumber, and stone, clay and glass industries employed more workers in September than any other time in the history of the State. In addition, the iron and steel industry set a new peacetime record with employment at the highest level since January 1944.

Employment in the manufacture of non-durable goods rose to 395,900 in September, 1948 from 370,400 in August and 362,000 in September, 1947. Part of the increase above a year ago was the result of the later coming season this year. Last year peak employment in the canning industry was in August.

The number of wage and salary workers in durable goods plants increased for the fourth consecutive month reaching 404,300 in September, 3,800 above the preceding month and 21,500 above a year ago.

The combined effect of these increases brought total employment in all manufacturing industries to a record peacetime total of 799,600 wage and salary workers in September, compared to 744,800 in September, 1947 and 742,500 in September, 1945.

Gardena Bus Line Adding New Service

Elimination of commutation tickets and a new bus line for the Gardena area today were approved by the city public utilities and transportation commission. Both charges apply to services rendered by the Gardena Municipal Bus Line.

The new line will operate primarily within the city limits of Gardena and within county territory. It enters Los Angeles to serve Garden Village. Bus officials said the change is proposed primarily for the benefit of school children.

The commission approved the elimination of the company's commutation tickets after the company explained it was operating at a monthly loss of about \$2000. The loss during August was \$2537, the line reported.

Urgent Call for Former Servicemen

The urgent call for 10,000 former servicemen as replacements in the United States Air Force to sustain our European "Operation Vittles" must be met quickly, M/Sgt. James R. Callison, Torrance Army and Air Force Recruiting Chief, said today.

Southern California's quota in the nationwide request will be met at Long Beach Air Base and March Air Base; however the recruiting station has information and applications for veterans with the proper Military Occupational Specialty or skill, according to Sgt. Callison.

Unmarried men up to 34 years of age, discharged from the Air Force more than 90 days, will be accepted in all grades up to and including Technical Sergeant. Married men, discharged from the Air Force more than 90 days must qualify for grades of Staff and Technical Sergeant.
