### Speaker Says U.S. Aid Not Helping Russ

Approximately 50 persons attended the World Affairs Forum sponsored by the Shoestring Strip Association and the Halliday P.T.A. Tuesday evening, and participants felt well rewarded for their efforts.

Glen H. Corbin, forum director, in his discussion of "Behind the Berlin Crisis" brought out the following points: (1) Russia occupies one-sixth of the world's population. (2) Within seven years Russia has risen to one of the two first-rate powers of the world. (3) The Berlin Crisis is the conflict between the Western Allies and Russia.

Upon being queried as to whether the United States material aid had helped Russia in attaining her present power, Corbin answered a flat "No" and quoted statistics to prove the gigantic known losses were five times greater than the aid our nation extended.

Time and again Corbin warned of the ruthlessness of Russia's Politburo, comprised of about 16 men who have attained their great power through the extreme sacrifices of 180 million peoples.

### New Conduit Plant Opens

(Continued from Page 1-A) thoroughly clean it in preparation for the electric plating process. More than 650 tubes are in the machine at one time.

Continuously moving chains with fibre "fingers" and fibre-tipped spokes projecting from steel hubs move the tubes through the vats at a rapid rate. This machinery is driven by one motor at the far end of the unit. The tubes finally pass through a drying oven, the last stage before the electric plating begins.

Electric converters which provide direct current at six volts but exceedingly high amperage put a coat of zinc on the outside of the tubes as required by the Underwriters Laboratories.

This process is carefully supervised by workmen along the way, until the tubes receive another clear-water bath and reach a machine which automatically sprays-paints the inside of them, five at a time.

Emerging from the final operation, the tubes are carefully inspected and banded together, five to a bundle, and made ready for shipping.

The Andersen-Carlson Company started in 1946, but delay in obtaining delivery of the \$300,000 plating unit has prevented the plant from getting under way until this month. Its products are sold through the Rome Products Corporation of New York.
