## Series of Four Lectures Slated In November at Adult School

Self-improvement, personality, psychology, health, sex education are the themes in the series of free lectures to be given each Monday night in November at the Torrance High School Auditorium. Sponsored by the Torrance Council PTA and presented by the Torrance School of Adult Education, the series will be spearheaded by Anne Juran on Monday night at 7:30, November 7. This Broadway address and founder of Helena Rubeinstein Career Girl Department will speak on "Your Personality and Human Relations."

Adele Davis will take the stand on November 24 with "Guarding Your Family Health." This prominent Palos Verdes citizen is author of five books on cooking, one a nation-wide best seller. Noted exponent of "you are what you eat," Miss Davis says she will shock and startle the audience with things that will renovate and improve their lives beyond expectation.

Dr. Ralph Timothy will give his "Case Histories in Human Relations" on November 21. A prominent personality consultant and advisor, Dr. Timothy is a faculty member of Harbor Junior College. He is noted for his simple down-to-earth, authentic, scientific way of solving personal problems.

On November 28, Dr. Ralph Eckert, chief of Bureau of Parent Education, Department of Education, State Department Education, will explain the "Role of the School in Sex Education." Dr. Eckert will show the explosive film "Human Growth," and will explain the problem of when and how to tell the story of life to children, and how the same story should be told by the schools.

"This will not be a series of lectures," says Donald Manshaw, director, Torrance School of Adult Education, "but it will be a series of vital, simple, open discussions of the problems and the needs of the people in the audience. We will have less hot air and more practical down-to-earth solutions of stirring and vital everyday problems about which people want to know the answers."
