Key 'Part Time' Positions Available in Air Reserves

Wanna be a "part-time Airman"? Word comes from the huge Air Force Training Base at Long Beach that key "part-time" Air Force Reserve positions are now open in the fast growing 448th Bomb Wing for civilians from all walks of life to participate in "two-day a month" training period.

With double pay for the training sessions, full uniform issues and other allowances, the program is what Californians would label "a good deal," and doesn't require any previous training or military experience. From the pedantic educator on down to the less obtrusive but all important "sweat-shirt" laborer, men and women of all vocations are currently enlisting in the Air Force Reserve's most live-wire outfit, helping to keep fleet Douglas B-26's in the air. "It's almost like going to school and getting paid for it," exclaim Reservists who are now in full swing with the program. A wide variety of specialized courses are offered them in all fields of Air Force endeavor. Completion of most of these courses brings a Military Occupation Specialty rating. That's just the first step toward promotion, higher pay and other rewards. In the event of a national emergency, Reservists have the edge on new inductees and graduates, since rank and grade earned in the Reserve training program will remain permanent.

Youth, 19, Badly Beaten by Four Young Attackers

Severely beaten and stabbed by four unidentified youths, Bill Olvera, 19, of Home 19 203rd street, was recovering at his home yesterday.

According to police reports, Olvera told officers he was driving north on Arlington avenue Monday night when his car was forced to the curb by another auto. The four assailants leaped from the car and attacked Olvera with fists, feet and a knife, the victim told police. He was taken to the Torrance Medical Center by a passerby where he was treated for lacerations on the arm and head, bruises, and a chest puncture.

Highway Patrol Acts to Lower Accident Toll

"Don't kid yourself." This warning was sounded this week to the state's five million automobile drivers by a man who knows. He is Clifford E. Peterson, Commissioner of the Highway Patrol, and he talked as the Patrol perfected plans to combat the December accident toll.

"This is the deadliest time of year because of shorter days and inclement weather, so don't kid yourself by thinking you can drive the same way you do at other times," Peterson said. "Last December we set a new all-time record of 328 deaths and 8,705 injuries, most of them the result of persons kidding themselves into believing they could do the impossible in traffic."

"Some were pedestrians who took careless chances, some were drivers who fought for the right-of-way, some tried to beat trains at crossings, some tried to stop without good brakes, and far too many tried to drive after drinking."

"You can't see as well in foggy or rainy weather and you can't stop as quickly on wet, slippery pavement. Don't kid yourself by thinking you can or you will be a statistic instead of a live Californian on Christmas morning."
