Special arrangements between the city and the Optimists have been completed that will bring a wrestling show to the Civic Auditorium every other Thursday.

Cecil Payne, well-known wrestling referee, has told the local club that some of the best names in the game will be booked for the first show—a March of Dimes benefit, two weeks from tonight.

Profits from subsequent shows will be used by the Optimist Club to support their Boys Work Program and to aid such other youth groups as the YMCA, Kiwanis Kids Day and similar youth activities.

Through the efforts of Arthur Sues, a club member and Superintendent of Transportation for the Todd Shipbuilding Company, a ring has been donated by the harbor boat firm.

Seats to accommodate 1200 fans will be set up for the semi-monthly bouts. Ringside seats will go for \$1.50, others at \$1.

The Optimists have obtained a regular business license from the City of Torrance and have agreed to pay \$45 rent on the

auditorium for each night of wrestling.


