Thousands of anglers in every section of the Southland are busy getting their gear in shape for the opening of the 1951 fishing season at Crowley Lake, the huge High Sierra "home of the big trout," on Saturday, April 28th, according to reports filtering in to the Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Dept.

To give every angler an equal chance to obtain the much-sought boat reservations, they will be assigned in the order in which applicants are in line at the door of the Recreation and Park Department's reservation office in Room 225, Los Angeles City Hall, at 8 a.m. on Monday, March 19th.

Telephone or mail applications for boat reservations for dates following the first week of the Crowley Lake season will also be accepted beginning March 19, the Recreation and Park Department announced. The number to call is Michigan 5211, Station 552.
