

## Group Evaluating Reports on Students

That three reports each school year, at least one of which should be a parent-teacher conference, was the minimum reporting policy adopted by a group of parents and school authorities at a meeting held last Friday afternoon.

The meeting, the second in a series of planned conferences, was held to formulate plans for adopting a standardized practice in the Torrance Unified School district for reporting to parents.

The group is attempting to investigate all forms of reporting both oral and written. Report cards and reporting forms from ten other school districts will be studied by the group to develop a format to be used in local schools.

One proposal was adopted by the group. That each year, preferably early in the term, a parent conference between all the parents of each class and the teacher should be held. An evening conference to encourage father's attendance was discussed. This group conference would be in addition to the three periodic reports suggested by the group. Because of the value derived from the parent-teacher conference it was felt that the conference type of report to be accompanied by a written guide form should be encouraged. For those parents who are unable to attend conferences with the teacher or for those parents who do not care to attend the oral report conference a written form will be used to inform the parent of his child's progress.

At the next meeting of the group the type and design of a report card will be studied by the group. To be considered also are the various "areas" to be

reported on. Suggested for study are physical development, emotional growth, relationships, reading, arithmetic, language, social studies, artistic development, and work and study habits.

Walter Rehwoldt, director of instruction of the school district, is directing the study group.


