Former Tartar Grid Star Joins Trojans

Donning a Trojan football uniform this week for a try at Jess Hill's grid machine at the University of Southern California was the star of last year's Tartar varsity and the star of last Friday night's All-Star game in San Diego—Aramis Dandoy.

Bumored to be seriously thinking of joining with a number of Torrance boys who left this week for the College of Idaho, Dandoy put an end to the idle talk Saturday by turning out on Bovard Field on the Trojan campus in an SC uniform.

BEST IN AREA

Dandoy, who wasn't even named on the CIF all-star selections this year despite his splendid performance in the Bay League, was named "Star of Stars" after the annual charity game in San Diego between the best of the CIF and the Los Angeles city leagues. He led the CIF squad to a 19-16 victory over the City All-Stars in a brilliant performance in Balboa Stadium.

Filling in on the squad at the insistence of Coach Rex Welch when the quarterback spot was considered weak, Dandoy showed his ability to such an extent that he was named to the starting lineup after the team had practiced two weeks.

He crashed across for the first touchdown of the game, and engineered a long march across the gridiron which ended with the CIF squad's second TD.

Dandoy was named "Star of Stars" by a panel of 125 sports-writers who watched the game from the stadium press box.

SUCCEEDS STITTS

The speedy Torrance star succeeded Narbonne High's Bill Stitts who was given the signal honor last year. The man named is the mythical No. 1 prep grid player in Southern California.

Players selected for the game were from such distant points as Santa Barbara and Calico, Govinda and Point Loma.

Dandoy will augment Hill's backfield on the Trojan squad and will be eligible to play on the varsity as a freshman because of a new ruling in the PCC. No one who saw him play last fall and again last Friday night doubts for a minute that he will be heard from in football stories coming from the SC campus during the next few years.
