More Qualified Women In Office IS NBPW Club Aim

The California Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs will be actively engaged in a program to elect more qualified women to public office, as a result of action of the board of directors at its meeting at Lake Tahoe, August 25-26. It was announced by Dr. Dorothy Patterson, state president.

The federation will work to ward electing women to the Legislature in 1952, in newly-created assembly and senatorial districts where there are no incumbents. Several new districts have been created in various parts of the state because of increased population.

A political promotion committee has been set up by the organization for this purpose. Committee members will be named by Dr. Patterson within a week.

To gain federation support, women who seek election must be endorsed by a local BPW club prior to presentation of names for consideration by the political promotion committee. If a candidate is successfully screened, the state federation has agreed

to financial support on a strictly voluntary basis. The organization will sponsor candidates equally representing both major political parties, according to Miss Geraldine Hadsell, state BPW legislation chairman.

Miss Hadsell also pointed out that in California there is now only one woman legislator out of 120. Similar proportions exist in other states and in Congress. In her opinion there is a great need for this type of program.
