Longren Request To Get Action At Next Meeting

Postponed until the next regular meeting of the City Council was action on a request by the Longren Aircraft Company which sought permission of the Torrance City Fathers last week to beautify and expand its facilities on Carson street.

The Planning Commission recommended the council approve the company's program, but only if the concern met five requirements suggested by the commission.

Mayor Bob L. Haggard informed the audience that a decision on the matter would not be rendered at Tuesday's meeting since some of the "evidence" in the case was not yet available to the council.

Objecting to the company's plan are a score of homeowners adjacent to the plant. City Clerk A. H. Bartlett read a petition signed by five pages of nearby residents objecting to the expansion program. A letter from L. W. Sawyer urging the council to deny the request also was read.

The Planning Commission had recommended approval of the company's proposal if the company complied with these requirements:

1. Refrain from any type of burning.
 2. Provide employees with a paved off-the-street parking area.
 3. Beautify the Date and Elm avenue frontages as well as the Carson street frontage.
 4. House all machinery within buildings and install such soundproofing as would be necessary to control excessive noise from machines.
 5. Complete the construction work within 120 work days.
- At a recent meeting of the commission, residents living near the plant which is located at 2567 W. Carson street, objected to the noise, dust and unkemptness of the plant. Plant officials explained that any move at the present was very unlikely since the company is engaged in manufacturing parts for seven major aircraft companies. A plan of remodeling and modernizing the exterior of the plant was drafted so that the industrial plant would be less of a community detriment.
