Number of Job Seekers About Same During Month

Unemployment totals for Torrance residents remained almost unchanged during the past month, according to a report issued last week by Mrs. Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance branch of the California Department of Employment.

At the time of the report, only 461 residents of Torrance were seeking employment through the local office, the manager reports. At the same time last month, 463 were registered at the office.

Of the 461 registered this month, 241 were men and 220 were women, while 25 per cent of the men were veterans.

Mrs. Ellis explained that many of the women seeking work were housewives re-entering the labor market for defense work. She also said recent school graduates accounted for many of those currently seeking a job.
